Julio López was born in San Pedro Sula, Honduras. He studied viola at the Hochschule für Musik Freiburg (Germany) with a scholarship from Deutsche Stiftung Musikleben.

He has been invited to different orchestras such as the Tromsø Chamber Orchestra and the Norwegian Arctic Philharmonic Orchestra.

He is a member of the *Tertis Viola Ensemble* with which he recorded an acclaimed CD with the OehmsClassics label.

He is currently a violist of the *Münchner Philharmoniker*.

Academic record

Julio López was born in San Pedro Sula, Honduras.

His first studies of viola began at the Escuela de Música Victoriano López, with Maestro Rubén Moncada. In 1999, he received a scholarship from the University of Southern Mississippi to pursue higher viola studies under the tutelage of Dr. Michael Kimber.

In 2003 he continued his higher studies of viola at the *Hochschule für Musik Freiburg*, Germany with Professor Wolfram Christ. In the same year he was awarded a scholarship by *Deutsche Stiftung Musikleben* in Germany and in 2007, he completed his viola training, graduating with honors.

Professional Experience

Since 2007 he has been a **permanent member** of the *Münchner Philharmoniker*, Germany with which he has toured worldwide. Since January 2014, he has also performed as lead violist and chamber musician alongside violinist Henning Kraggerud and the Tromsø Chamber Orchestra / Norwegian Artic Philharmonic Orchestra.

He is also a member of the viola ensemble, called the *Tertis Viola Ensemble*, with an acclaimed CD production with **OehmsClassics** company.

As a soloist, he has performed with many orchestras, highlighting the *Orquesta Filarmónica del Ecuador, la Orquesta Filarmónica de Honduras* and *Orquesta de Cámara de San Pedro Sula*. Julio López has given recitals in the *United States*, Italy, Spain, Croatia and Germany; and he has been regularly invited to teach viola courses in *Honduras*, *Ecuador* and *Costa Rica*.

He was recently invited as a viola teacher for the *Orquesta Juvenil de Centroamericana* project, which is organized by the *Goethe Institute* and the government of *Germany*. As part of the *Gustav Mahler Academy of Music and Academy*, he collaborated with distinguished musicians, including *Wenn-Sinn Yang* of the *Hochschule für Musik und Theater München*, *Eszter Haffner* of the *Karl-Franzens-Universität Graz* in Austria, Eszter Haffner of the *Hochschule für Musik Freiburg*.

His recognitions include the first prize in the Villas Llanes international viola contest in 2006, Asturias Spain. In 2002, he was a member of the USB Verbier Festival Orchestra and UBS Chamber Orchestra, Switzerland, playing throughout Europe, Asia and America.

He has participated in important projects with international soloists including works with teachers such as Hartmut Rohde from the *Universität der Künste Berlin*, Walter Kuessner from the *Hochschule für Musik Hanns Eisler Berlin*, Roberto Diaz from the *Curtis Institute of Music*, USA, Yuri Gandelsman, *Fine violist Arts Quartet*, University of Milwauke, Wisconsin USA, Michael Kugel of the *Gent Conservatory, Csaba Erdély* and Alexander Brussulovsky.
